## Project Summary

This project will offer central support for volunteering and engagement opportunities across the whole of the Landscape Partnership programme, as well as supporting the Pendle Hill volunteer group. The project will also co-ordinate the variety of learning opportunities offered across the programme, including training events and open days, and a summer school in 2020. There will also be a 'Get into Volunteering' programme encouraging pre-formed groups to volunteer for a session and get involved in further volunteering or in the PEN project.

## Outputs & Outcomes

18 training days, 166 beneficiaries

Volunteers gain confidence and experience.
Members of 'hard to reach' groups join Pendle Hill volunteers group or join the PEN project sessions

## Legacy

Pendle Hill volunteer group will continue to volunteer throughout the Pendle Hill landscape and will become self – sufficient, with support provided by the AONB as required. The group may become more site-based to ensure the development of a more structured work plan, but will also have links with the local councils and organisations so can find volunteer tasks in this capacity.
