Ensure that groups are reasonably quiet and well-ordered when passing through fields of farm animals. Wash hands or use sanitiser before eating. Participants to carry waterproof warm coat, as it can be cooler on the summit and very windy Ensure there is plenty of drinking water for all participants and encourage water stops. Keep an eye on participants for fatigue individuals and encourage rest. 	L	M





Traffic and other road users on roads and driveways	Μ	Н	 Participants made aware of the presence of traffic and other road users and expected behaviour made clear. Supervising adults in high visibility clothing positioned at the front and back and evenly throughout the group when walking on roadsides. Where there is no pavement participants warned in advance and instructed to be in single file or tight pairs and as close as possible to the outside of the road. Judgement made by the Officer as to the safest side of the road to walk on. Road crossings made in a controlled and organised manner with a supervising adult positioned in the road at either side of the crossing group in such a position that they are visible to traffic and approaching traffic can be seen.
