Hats, scarves, gloves, sun cream etc.</li> <li>Weather to be checked on day, and activity cancelled if too cold, windy or too warm.</li> <li>Participants to carry waterproof warm coat, as it can be cooler on the summit and very windy</li> <li>Ensure there is plenty of drinking water for all participants and encourage water stops.</li> <li>Keep an eye on participants for fatigue individuals and encourage rest.</li> </ul>	L	M





Traffic and other road users on roads and driveways	Μ	Н	<ul> <li>Participants made aware of the presence of traffic and other road users and expected behaviour made clear.</li> <li>Supervising adults in high visibility clothing positioned at the front and back and evenly throughout the group when walking on roadsides.</li> <li>Where there is no pavement participants warned in advance and instructed to be in single file or tight pairs and as close as possible to the outside of the road.</li> <li>Judgement made by the Officer as to the safest side of the road to walk on.</li> <li>Road crossings made in a controlled and organised manner with a supervising adult positioned in the road at either side of the crossing group in such a position that they are visible to traffic and approaching traffic can be seen.</li> </ul>	L	Н
Participants getting lost/separated from the group	Μ	М	<ul> <li>Clear instructions/expectations for behaviour</li> <li>Participants supervised by visiting adults at a ratio appropriate to the age and experience of the group.</li> <li>Supervising adults spread throughout the group with a designated back marker to ensure no participant drops behind.</li> <li>Participants counted at the beginning and end of the walk and at regular stopping sites.</li> </ul>	L	М
Inappropriate interaction between participants and members of the public	Μ	L	<ul> <li>Groups/activity planned and managed by ECT/PHLP staff to minimise interaction between participants and the public when/where this might be undesirable/inappropriate.</li> <li>Participants supervised by visiting adults at a ratio appropriate to the age and experience of the group.</li> <li>Behaviour monitored and managed by visiting adults throughout the activity.</li> </ul>	L	L
