Project Summary

Working with local farmers and volunteers we will survey, restore and manage important habitats for wildlife across the LP area, including species rich grassland and moorland. We will also engage more people in community wildlife activities which increase their understanding of and support for nature conservation across Pendle Hill. This project will offer training opportunities in habitat surveying and species identification and encourage the local community to record species and input findings to LERN (Lancashire Environment Record Network).
