Pendle Hill Fund Year 2 Projects

Overview

The second window for applications opened on 18th August 2019 for 6 weeks. The Community Engagement Officer advertised the Fund through social media, local contacts and local press beforehand, and was available to discuss potential project ideas with applicants before they submitted their final application.

In total, the Fund received 9 project applications, of which 6 were successful.

Projects PHF2_002 – The Rotary Club of Burnley Pendleside: Kids Away 2020

Start date: November 2019

End date: latest November 2021

Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £3000

Match funding offered: £1000

The Rotary Club aims to offer 40 young people from Pendle (in groups of 10) to Whitehough Outdoor Centre, where they will be able to enjoy themselves and learn about the surrounding Pendleside environment and history. The Rotary Club will work with local schools and community groups to offer this opportunity to those children who would most benefit from it.

Due to the global pandemic, activity has been postponed and so this project has received a 12 month extension until November 2021.

PHF2_003 – Clitheroe Young Famers: CYFC Traditional Boundaries Restoration Project

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £2468.08

Match funding offered: £750

This project aims to increase skills and knowledge of members by providing them with training in traditional boundary restoration techniques. The project will include 3 courses for Young Famers: 1 x Lantra hedge laying qualification for senior members; 1 x beginner's hedge laying course for junior/intermediate members; beginner's dry stone walling course. The group will also purchase their own equipment so they can continue these skills.

All of the training has been completed, however the planned celebration events and certificate presentation has been delayed because of the pandemic. The project has been extended for another 12 months until November 2021.

PHF2_004 – Rimington Memorial Institute: Rimington Oral Heritage project

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £2130.00

Match funding offered: £450

The heritage and stories in Rimington are at risk of being lost, and so this project aims to capture these stories using volunteers, as well as recording the poems of Christine Thistlethwaite who grew up and used to live in the village. The project will be launched with a heritage event in the village and will involve website development.

Due to the pandemic the volunteer part of this project has been postponed, and so the project will be extended to November 2021.

PHF2_005 – Martholme Greenway: Simonstone Lane to Gooseleach Wood

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant claimed: £2091.60

Match funding offered: £3525 (volunteer time)

The Martholme Greenway volunteers have been working to re-open the stretch of disused railway/greenway between Simonstone Lane and Gooseleach Wood. This project has added 2 picnic benches for public use to the route, as well as two interpretation boards. One of these boards include information about the historic site of Constant Mary waterwheel, and one about Gooseleach Woods and surrounding footpaths. The benches and info boards have been well received by members of the public. This project has now been completed.

PHF2_006 – Roughlee PC: Finger Post Renovation

End date: latest October 2021

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £2500

Match funding offered: £2500

This project aims to work across in different parishes across the LP area, repairing and renovating old style white finger signposts.

PHF2_009 – Friends of Spring Wood: Spring Wood Pond and Access Project

Start date: November 2019

End date: latest November 2021

Final Pendle Hill Fund grant requested: £10000

Match funding offered: £6623.60

The group aims to rejuvenate and improve the long term future of different aspects of the popular Spring Wood site. This work includes improvements to the pond - removing deep silt built up over time and opening up the pond fringe to improve sunlight – along with access improvements on the paths and footbridges. The group will also develop lesson plans and put together a box of nature investigation resources for schools and community groups to use in the future.

Some of the work has been completed, however the volunteer elements have been delayed by Covid 19 pandemic, and so this project has been extended to November 2021.
